Resurrection Litturgy






We understand.




May Procession







First Holy Communion Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes on 22nd May 2023.


24 of our children made their First Holy Communion this year in 5 different parishes in Hull. Each child received a children's Bible as a gift from the school in remembrance of their special day.

Be Spirited Day 2023




- Our day consisted of 3 sessions focusing on:

Class 1 had oranges as their Fruit of the Spirit.








Every child in the school made a flame.
